
One of the highlights of 2014 were, for me, the Purple Emperors at Botany Bay.

My first image was in bag after i had located it again at top of an Oak tree. Later in the morning this specimen gave the waiting cameras some spectacular views.

Another lovely specimen (see one of my images) had some additional tiny white spots on his open wings, but denied us his purple sheen. In all, over two days i witnessed a total of 10 Emperors on the ground. A very magical experience indeed!.


HI All,


In all a lovely day out, and that warning light never came on again.
