

We then looked a bit closer round the car park and found a Marbled White which was my first of the year.

Later I saw Small Heaths then found some Brown Argus and Common Blues and an occasional Chalkhill Blue. I also found a caterpillar I was hoping someone could identify for me. I was also intrigued to see an arrow on the path pointing in to some trampled long grass but followed it and didn't spot anything. On the way home I briefly stopped at Anchor Bottom then Beeding Cement Works. In the lane to Anchor Bottom I found a Comma, Small Tortoiseshell and Painted Lady. There I found 2 Clouded Yellows, many Brown Argus, a few Common Blues a well as Meadow Browns and Small Heaths. At Beeding Cement Works (the briefest of stops walking round the everlasting pea three times), a Common Blue flew off the everlasting pea and a Meadow Brown was nearby.




